

Terms of participation

Ideas

Deliverables provided by the participant of the Schenck Process Holding NEXT Hackathon will be available to other participants and third parties free of charge as common property in the public domain.

Submissions

By submitting a hackathon entry to the contest and providing any kind of IP-related input the participant grants Schenck Process and its affiliated companies a worldwide, perpetual, irrevocable, non-exclusive right and license, with the right to sublicense, discuss, publicize, market, and otherwise display content derived from or relating to the hackathon entry and to distribute and use the submission for promotional and marketing purposes either in the form submitted or in the form of a derivative or adapted work.

Compensation

The participant understands that he or she will not receive any compensation or credit for use of the hackathon entry, other than what is described in the Official Hackathon Rules.

Copyright

The participant warrants that he or she is the sole author and copyright owner of the submission and that the submission is the participant's original work.

Publication of Data

By participating in the Schenck Process NEXT Hackathon the participant agrees that personal data (such as name, photos and videos taken during the event, country of origin, university) can be used for marketing purposes. Marketing purposes in this context include all marketing channels of the Schenck Process Group inclusive but not limited to Instagram, Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter and YouTube. The duration of use depends on the marketing purpose which is determined by Schenck Process. A revocation of this consent is not in every case acceptable, in particular if Schenck Process can assert a right to use also without consent.
