Our commitment to comply with the EC Directive on Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment



The first edition of the Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment Directive (WEEE-Directive 2002/96/EC) was implemented on 13th August 2005 throughout Europe. The revised Directive (2012/19/EU) was implemented on 14 February 2014. The purpose of this Directive is to prevent the uncontrolled disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment and to provide it with meaningful reuse, recycling or any other form of recovery. In the following, Schenck Process explains the own recycling scheme on basis of this WEEE-Directive.

According to this guideline, Schenck Process products are identified as B2B products and subsequently are marked in accordance with the WEEE directive. The symbol of a crossed out waste can is attached to all products.

If you find the crossed out waste can on a product that you have purchased from us, please take note of the following information when disposing the product:

As an operator, you are generally obliged to properly recycle the products you have received.

In Europe, you have two options for this:

- I. You will hand over the products to a local recycler and bear any costs incurred.
- II. you make use of the solution described by us below, in which case the costs are shared proportionally:

Schenck Process has a recycling contract with the European Advanced Recycling Network (EARN) and bears the costs for the treatment, recycling and recovery of the equipment after it has been delivered to an EARN partner facility.

To send an WEEE from Schenck Process for recycling, please open the "Return Form" web link below and enter your relevant company details. The document that is subsequently generated contains the relevant address of the recycling plant, as well as you as the sender and other necessary information for processing. Please print this document and attach it to the package with the old device so that it is visible from the outside.

- No deliveries will be accepted without prior approval. All costs for unapproved deliveries will be charged. Please note that the Schenck Process companies normally are not the valid take-back points.
- Schenck Process pays the costs for the treatment, recycling and recovery of the WEEE products.
- Schenck Process pays the costs of data management and reporting to government agencies to substantiate the administrative requirements of the WEEE Directive.
- In return, you organize the collection of old devices and pay the transport costs to a collection point authorized by Schenck Process.
